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How Evangelism is Fostered, Taught & Reinforced

Our greatest objective as Christians is to glorify God. Nothing so glorifies God as the salvation of a soulespecially as that soul begins to live for Him, and in so doing, leads others to Christ. This is why personal evangelism is ever the primary application of all the teaching being done at NBBS. Our faculty, made up of preachers, are encouraged to share stories thereunto in class and in chapel. Sayings and Scripture are posted on the wall, or incorporated in the regular communications to the students. Songs are sung in chapel that promote personal evangelism. Students, in prayer times before class, or in chapel, spontaneously request prayer for persons they are seeking to win to Christ, or who have just been led to Christ.

Personal Evangelism is Taught Throughout the NBBS Program

The Four Gospels and the Book of Acts are replete with examples of evangelism, and the Epistles are saturated with like challenges and instruction. The course Apologetics, is geared largely to equip the students to be able to witness to everyone they encounter in keeping with I Peter 3:15. They are taught it is not about "out arguing" someone, but rather using what they learn to clear the way for the Gospel to be presented. In the World Religions and Cults class, the students are not just taught the erroneous beliefs of others, but how to lead them away from error unto Christ. In the Bible Doctrine III class, wherein the doctrine of salvation is studied, the students learn more clearly the Biblical teaching on salvation. In keeping with this, they are directed to put what they are learning into practice in their evangelistic efforts. The courses on Church Planting, Pastoral Ministry and Church Administration

instruct not only on this subject, but address the need for a training and actual program of personal evangelism to be a primary part of the church's ministry. The class on Prayer, encourages students to pray for those they are seeking to win to Christ, and to have a prayer list thereunto. Furthermore, in English Composition II, the students write a personal testimony tract, one that can be printed and passed out to people. The full semester course of Personal Evangelism, teaches the students how to witness better and it seeks to motivate them to do so. Key Scriptures are pointed out, and illustrations are given to be used in witnessing. They have an assigned sup-



porting textbook to read in order to be further instructed on how to win the lost, and to be further inspired to do so. In the Teaching Children I & II class, the students are taught not only how to prepare the way for their salvation, but also how to more effectively present the Gospel to them (II Timothy 3:15). The Missions III course, addresses the cross-cultural barriers missionaries face when seeking to evangelize. In the Weeks of Concentrated Study that are conducted each semester, one of the studies is on evangelism. Daily, in Chapel, preachers often challenge the students to stay fervent in their witnessing.

Christian Service Reports

We readily recognize that the students are accountable to their pastor and church for their Christian service, but we provide a form onto which they are to record their witnessing efforts and results for the past month. The form is afterwards to be signed by their pastor and returned to the school to be part of their academic record. A passion for winning others to Christ is one that is best both caught and taught.
