

Schooled on the Road to Emmaus

There are several Bible Surveys within the text of the Bible. They are found in the writings of Moses, the Psalms, even in Nehemiah and Ezekiel, as well as in the Book of Hebrews (e.g., Deuteronomy 1-3; Psalm 78, 105, 106, Nehemiah 9:7-31, Ezekiel 20:5-32; Acts 7, 13:14-37; Hebrews 11). **However, can you imagine what it must have been like to walk from Genesis through Malachi with Christ as your guide as did the two disciples that resurrection Sunday afternoon on their way to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-32)?**

One could refer to the Norris Bible Baptist Seminary as the "Road to Emmaus Seminary." We mirror, in various formats, what Bible writers did, and what Christ did on that Road some 2,000 years ago! School Year Well Underway!

We are nearing the halfway mark of the semester – one that saw us enroll **61 students**, a number which ties the highest enrollment of the past. The student body is characterized as always with men between the ages of 17 and 75, and several women who desire to be better prepared in their service unto the Lord. Four of our student body are alumni who have returned in order to secure a Bachelor's degree. Prospective students for second semester look good.

Although, we have been conducting classes in classrooms, and in a chapel area that are cooled by a single air-conditioning system that is down to running on one compressor, because of cooler temperatures, not usually characteristic of August and September in north Texas, we have generally not been unduly distracted by the heat and humidity. There have been a few exceptions, and the A/C unit has needed some "first-aid" from time to time, and some well placed floor fans have greatly helped.

In view of the Independent Baptist Builders ministry being able to replace the one big 35-year old 15-ton unit with three 5-ton high efficiency units, for \$19,000 because we only have to pay for the equipment, **we are just \$3,500 away from them ordering the machines and getting the installation under way.** We are so thankful for the churches, pastors, missionary, faculty, Sunday school class, students, and friends who have contributed toward this need.

We went next door to the Conference Center for our Norris Night, Saturday, September 29 because of the A/C shutting down on us Thursday, and in need of another quick fix on the Monday/Tuesday following. The Norris Night is a time of fellowshiping for the students, and their families and friends and prospective students. We first have a meal, then the students preach, and then we have a drawing for gift books. **This past one was one of our best.** About half of the student body was able to make it. Church involvements, job situations, and distance largely prevented the rest from being in attendance.
